AFTER SCHOOL CLUB: Following a safeguarding and booking systems review it has been agreed by the governing body that after school club will only take bookings from a week in advance and the full week paid up front. This new procedure starts after xmas and pupils booked in the first week back must be booked in and paid for by Monday 12th December. This means that we will no longer accept bookings on the day or emergencies. We are sorry for the need to make this change but feel it is absolutely necessary on safety and safeguarding grounds and is in line with other school providers in the county. Pupils not collected in an emergency will remain with the headteacher or senior manager as they would in a school without an after school club. After school club closes at 5 pm. Any pupil remaining after this time will remain with a senior manager and after a short period of time will be classed as an uncollected child and referred to the police/ social services in line with our safeguarding procedures. Thank you for your understanding in this matter which is to keep all pupils safe. The cost remains the same at £3.50 for the first child and £2.50 for siblings.

BREAKFAST CLUB: There is no change to the booking system for breakfast club. The cost remains the same at £2 first child and £1 sibling.

MAKE £5 GROW PROJECT: Pupils in classes 7 and 8 are very excited to be working with Virgin Money on a business and enterprise project this term. PARKING BAY: Please respect other parents, do not swear or be aggressive as this frightens our children. Be patient, allow plenty of time for your drop off and this will enable everyone to get their children into school on time.
