INCREASE IN DINNER MONEY: As from September 2018 dinner money will increase to £2.05 per day which is £10.25 per week. Please note this is county wide and not a school decision.

EAST DURHAM TRUST have once again asked us to do a food bank collection to support their work over the summer break for needy families in our community. If you can contribute any food we would be most grateful. Your child will earn 5 team points for a carrier bag of food. Many thanks for your anticipated support in this important initiative.

HEALTHY PUPILS: We have an issues with parent sending pupils into school too early after they have been ill with vomiting. They must be off school for 24 hours after the last sickness. Pupils with Diarrhoea must be off school for 48 hours after their last bout. Children are being sent back to school too early and this is highly contagious. Where there is a concern about a pupils attendance medical evidence must be shown. PLEASE TEACH YOUR CHILD TO WASH THEIR HANDS THOROUGHLY AFTER USING THE TOILET AND BEFORE EATING.

SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN MISSING FROM EDUCATION: Please be aware that we are required to report any child we feel is missing from education. If your child is on holiday we may report them missing if you have not completed an application for leave. This can be obtained from the front desk.

SATURDAY EVENTS: The Academy now hold weekly ‘Lets Create’ sessions and ‘Pop School’ sessions for £5. For more information contact Kathryn Ackley at the Academy.

If you require emergency after school care please make arrangements with other child care providers in the town. Club closes promptly at 5 pm. Pupils remaining in school after this time will be in the care of social services.

FIRST CONTACT: If you have a concern about a child or young person who lives in County Durham, First Contact is the service to call. First Contact brings together staff from Children and Young People's Services with partners such as Durham Constabulary and Health.

What happens if I call First Contact? When you contact First Contact, you will speak to a trained officer who will work with you to decide the level of response needed. Providing early help to children, young people and their families is their priority.

An Early Help Assessment will be started to help inform the next steps, which may be:

☑ A referral to preventative services such as One Point, with a 'team around the family' and a named lead professional. Giving you appropriate advice and guidance.

☑ A statutory referral to assessment and interventions teams due to safeguarding concerns, with a 'team around the family' and a named lead professional. First Contact works to a Single Assessment Framework which can be found on the Durham County Council website.
