We were delighted with our SATs results which came out this week for our oldest pupils: Reading 79.5% which is 8.5% above the national figure and up 14.5% on last years results

Maths 86.4% which is 11.4% above the national figure and up 23.4% on last years results SPAG 84.1% which is 7.1% above the national figure and up 12.1% on last years results Writing 81.8% which is 5.8% above the national figure and up 19.8% on last years results RWM combined 72.7% which is 11.7% above the national figure and up 25.7% on last years results Well done year 2!

Reading 82% met the expected standard which is well above the national standard of 74% Writing 76% met the expected standard which is well above the national standard of 65% Maths 80% met the expected standard which is well above the national standard of 73% Science 96% met the expected standard which is well above the national standard of 82% RWM combined 72% met the expected standard. This is a great achievement Well done those who sat phonics test in year 1 - 96.1% met this standard which is well above the national standard of 81%.

Well done to our early years children- 77.6% met the good level of development which is well above the national figure of 69%.

BOOK FAIR FUND RAISING - We sold £1271.72 of books and raised £763.03 through the book fair. Thanks to all who came to buy books and those who helped to sell and choose. Particular thanks to our governor Mrs Winn who has done this job for so many years now she has lost count!

CLASS MOVES- We had a very exciting morning last Friday when our children went to visit their new classes and teachers. Some children will be staying in the same class because of the change in numbers of rooms for next year. We will have classes 1 through to 12 and no sunshine or rainbow rooms. We will have two mixed age reception and year 1 classes and both groups of pupils will receive their appropriate statutory curriculum. All year groups will be mixed age and pupils will get opportunities to play with their opposite classes at lunch and break times, on special fun days and on visits. All teachers are experienced at teaching a mixed age range and I am confident we can maintain our very high standards of teaching and learning. Please note that no children are being 'held back' as I have heard some parents saying. This is not the case and all pupils will be taught the curriculum for their year group. The schools reputation is growing and we are very much in demand. To address this we have worked extremely hard to ensure all pupils are given excellent provision which will meet their learning needs within the building.

NEW WINDOWS- We are very pleased with our new stained glass windows in our reception area. This is part of a parent and child project where families worked together to make a stained glass plaque. This was then transferred onto laminate and is now decorating our windows. Come on in to have a look- you will be amazed!

NEW HISTORY TIMELINE-We are very proud of our visiting artist in school who has painted us a new fabulous history timeline in the heart space. It features local history as well as world events and significant periods. It was wonderful to watch a real artist at work. Our children think it is 'fabulous'!
