AFTER SCHOOL CLUB: Bookings must be made via the office one full week in advance for ALL pupils. Mrs Wilson is the contact for this. To cancel you must give at least 24 hours notice or you will still be charged the full amount. The club closes strictly at 5 pm and staff are not paid after this time and leave the premises. Pupils left after 5 pm will be referred to social services in line with our non-collection of children policy. The cost of ASC is £3.50 per day- this is excellent value for money and ensures the safety of your child as they will be collected from class and delivered to the ASC in the small hall.

AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS CLUBS: Please meet your child at the reception if you can. As the dark evening are here, please note we will not escort your child down the path way to you waiting in your car. Children must be collected from the reception area at 4.15 pm or allowed to walk home alone. **There is no supervision down the pathway.**

SAFEGUARDING: the online world is posing an ever-increasing risk to children and it is important that schools, parents and carers work together to take an active role in teaching children about online dangers and how to act safely when using the internet. We are delighted to announce that Shotton Hall Primary School is committed to protecting our pupils online and are working with national online safety to ensure all our children are safe online. We will soon be letting parents and carers know how they can support their child in this area. Please keep an eye on newsletters, our school facebook page and our website for further updates. NEW: A worrying number of children in school are talking about playing computer games and watching TV programmes which are not suitable for their age range. Children have been talking about horror games such as Granny's, Five Nights at Freddy's and Baldi's Education in School, which are PEGI rate 13+. These games have graphic horror images and are intended to scare and thrill the player. Parents guides which offer further advice on these games is available at https://www.commonsensemedia.org. Children have also been talking about TV shows they stream on Netflix which are aimed at teenage audiences, such as Riverdale which is age 15+ and has adult themes of sex and relationships. We urge parents to be aware of games their children are playing and shows they are watching on tablets and iPads and make an informed decision as to their suitability. If you have any concerns regarding online safety please don't hesitate to contact our online safety officer Mrs J Egglestone.

GENERAL APPEARANCE OF PUPILS: In line with our uniform policy I respectfully remind you of the following: Hair: We reserve the right to decide that the cut and colour of a pupil's hairstyle is inappropriate e.g. tramlines, Mohicans or extreme short sides with longer hair on top. Hair should be a natural colour. Hair bands and bows should be thin and not overly decorative.

Piercings: Pupils may wear one small, single metal <u>stud</u> in each earlobe - no other piercings are allowed. Parents are advised that if a child is to have a piercing it must take place at the start of the six weeks holiday and it must be removed on the first day of term. Pupils must be able to remove their earrings for PE.

Tattoos: No tattoos of any kind, even temporary.

Jewellery: No necklaces, bracelets or rings. A small watch may be worn.

Nails: No false, gel or acrylic nails - natural coloured nail varnish only and nails must be of a sensible length to work and to keep all pupils safe.

Make up: Strictly no false eyelashes or make-up of any kind including lip gels.
