



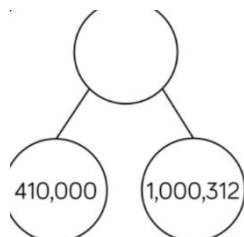

Simple sentences contain a subject and a verb.

Compound sentences are made up of two simple sentences connected by a coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS).

Complex sentences include an independent clause (simple sentence), a dependent clause and a subordinating conjunction (ISAWAWABUB).
