



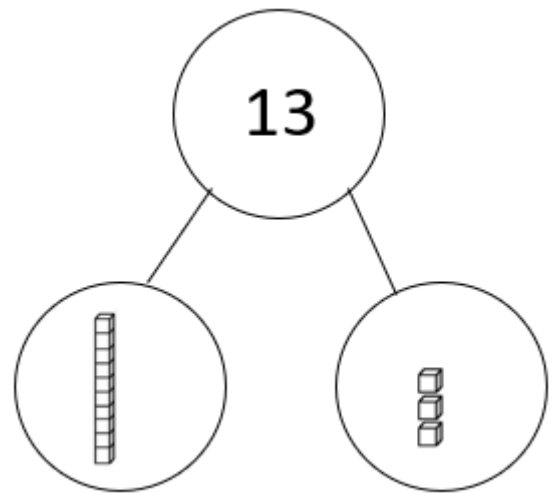
Maths

Count out 13 blocks of lego (or whichever resources you were using for Wednesday's lesson). How many tens can you make? How many ones are left over?

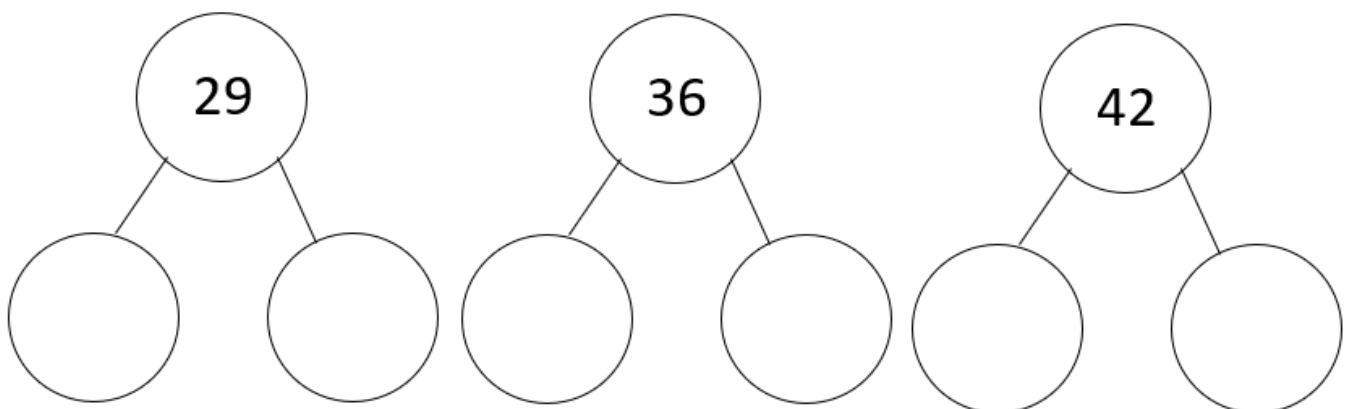
There are ___ tens and ___ ones.

We can put these into a two part whole model to show the tens and the ones of a number. The tens go in one part and the ones go in the other part to make the whole number at the top, like this:

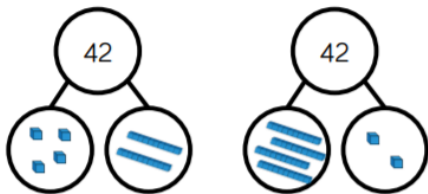
