



It is very important to think about how many tens and how many ones are in each of the numbers. It is also important for your child to be able to think about how the number is written as a word.

You can use pictures or practical representations to show the numbers – get creative!

As everyone's representations will be using different objects, there are no 'answers' for this question. Ask a grown up to check your representations are correct.

English

We are going to think about the wolf from the story of Little Red Riding Hood which we shared last week. Have a close look at the picture provided – could this be the wolf from a different version of the story? Talk about the picture with your grown up and try to describe what the wolf looks like, what he might be doing and where he is going.

Here are some sentences describing the wolf but they are a bit mixed up! Write the sentences with the words in the correct order. Remember to look for clues such as the word with a capital letter and the word with a full stop or an exclamation mark. You might find it easier to write each word on a piece of paper to help you order them correctly.

Answers

- 1. The wolf has sharp teeth and pointy claws.
- 2. He is hiding quietly behind the huge tree.
