Maths

Hi everyone, I have posted a video on Youtube that will be very useful for you to watch before you try our maths challenges this week.

How many different ways can you represent the following numbers? Here is an example of different ways I could think of to represent 23 :


It is very important to think about how many tens and how many ones are in each of the numbers. It is also important for your child to be able to think about how the number is written as a word.
You can use pictures or practical representations to show the numbers - get creative!

1. 18
2. 44
3. 50
