English

'Flotsam' is the word for the wreckage of a ship or the cargo (the items it was carrying) which have been lost at sea and then washed up a long time later on the shore. People might think that items that are flotsam are worthless, but as we read the story we'll see that this isn't true. The first page of the book shows lots of different things that might have been found on a beach. Other ways that we can tell that the book has something to do with the beach and the sea are the fish on the cover and the seashells. If you look at the way all of the flotsam has been laid out in neat rows, it suggests that someone has collected it, rather than it just being washed up on the sand. Finally, if you look really closely at the fish's eye on the cover, you can see that he is looking at something. Can you tell what it is? It is very important to the story!

Foundations Subject – Geography

This half term in Geography we are going to be finding out about the Mediterranean and thinking about the question, 'Why do so many people go to the Mediterranean for their holidays?'

I can identify the countries that have a coastline on the Mediterranean Sea and some islands and label them on a map.

1. Can you name any of the world's oceans and seas? 2 minute timer – Go!
Check on a map once you have tried. (See additional resources p1)
2. On your world map locate the Mediterranean Sea. (See additional resources p2)
3. Use Google earth to find the names of the countries which have a Mediterranean coastline and the islands in the Mediterranean. Label these countries and islands on your map of the Mediterranean region (see additional resources p3 – you can print this out if not number each one and make a note in your homework book/paper). If you can't access Google Earth then you could use an atlas or globe. **See map answer sheet for correct answers**
