Look at the next two pages of the story (additional resource 1). Can you see what has been washed up now? Today you need to write the dialogue (the speech between characters) from the picture that I've outlined in red. You need to include all of the correct features of speech. Remember that:

- The first inverted comma goes before the first word spoken and the second one goes after the last word spoken
- Speech always starts with a capital letter
- A reporting clause is needed to tell the reader who is speaking and how they said it
- A comma separates the speech and reporting clause, so if the reporting clause is after the speech, the speech will end in a comma. If it is before, there will be a comma after the reporting clause and the speech will end in a full stop, exclamation mark or question mark
- New speaker, new line
