Maths

Can you use two different objects to make patterns using ABB, AAB, AABB or AABBB? (e.g. pen, pen, pencil, pencil, pencil). Repeat the pattern at least three times if you can. Say the pattern aloud as this will help you make sure you have made the pattern correctly. You could also make your pattern around the edges of shapes (e.g. around a rug or a tray) as well as in a straight line!

You may even like to try using three or four different objects in patterns such as ABCC, AABBC or ABBCCD!

Have a go at drawing two of your favourite repeating patterns. You could also use numbers, letters or shapes in your patterns!

Answers

There are no right or wrong answers with this work! Talk with your grown up about the patterns you have drawn to check that they are correct. We would love to see your drawings!
