




Maths
Can you use your knowledge of finding one more/one less to complete the sentences? (Remember to use your knowledge of counting in tens first and then adding the ones, for example, for Q1, we would count 10, 20, 21, 22)
Answers -
Q1.
There are 22 blocks. One more than 22 is 2 3 . One less than 22 is 21 .
Q2.
There are 30 blocks. One more than 30 is 31 . One less than 30 is 29 .
Q3.



There are **49** blocks. One more than **49** is **50**. One less than **49** is **48**.

Challenge –

When finding one more/one less, which digit changes? (The tens or the ones?) It is usually the ones digit that changes, however if the ones are a 9, adding one more will mean the tens and the ones digits will change. Why?

For example, adding one more to 19 changes the one ten to two tens, and the 9 ones to 0 ones to make 20.
