

Share your work with your adult to decide if you placed the points on your compass correctly. A good way to remember the points on the compass is to remember Never (North), Eat (East), Slimy (South), Worms (West) or Naughty (North), Elephants (East), Squirt (South), Water (West). It really does make it easier!
