Maths

This week our work will focus on counting in 2s. To help you remember start by watching the counting in twos video that we watch regularly in class -

Today I would like you to practise counting in twos until you know them forwards and backwards; below is a list of some fun ways to help you practise whilst having fun.

- Throw a ball to a grown up, counting up in twos as you catch the ball. If you are confident counting up in twos, practise counting backwards in twos.
- Draw a hopscotch in your garden/outside where the numbers count up in twos, count up as you hop up and counting backwards in twos as you hop back.
- Draw your own twos number line to help you.
- If you have animals/lego bricks/pairs of shoes or anything else you can line up in twos, can you make a line of twos up to 50? Can you count them forwards and backwards?
- Use the link below to get to a 50 grid. Can you put a coloured paint splat on all of the numbers you say when counting in twos?
