



### Maths – Answers (4.5.20)

Fluent in 5:

1.  $345 \times 23 = 7935$ . You should have used long multiplication for this
2.  $2/8 + 2/8 = 4/8$  but our final answer should be in its simplest form:  $\frac{1}{2}$
3.  $456,231 - 387,123 = 69,108$ . You should have used column subtraction for this.
4.  $12,654 + 21,329 = 33,983$  You should have used inverse operation for this:  
 $33,983 - 12,654$
5.  $0.56 \times 100 = 56$

$$\boxed{420} \div 10 = 42$$


