What does $<$ mean? How do you know?

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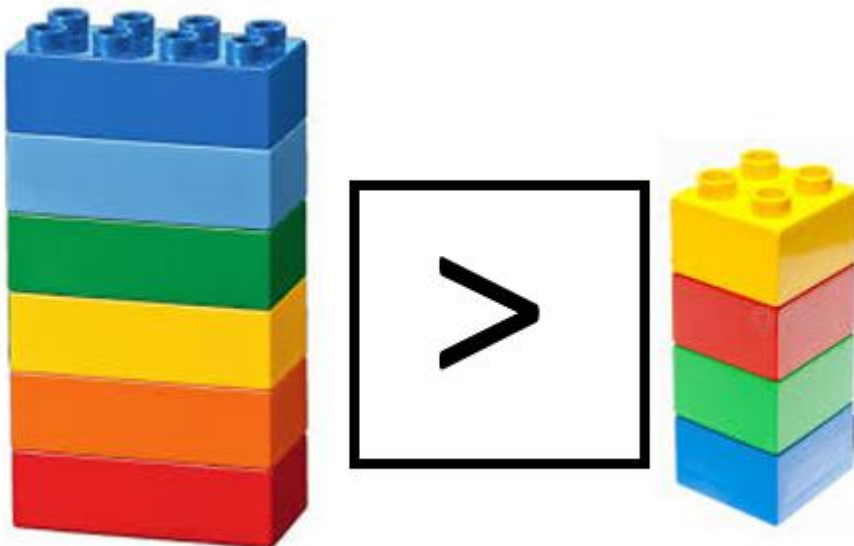
What does $=$ mean? How do you know?

Game -

Make towers of lego/blocks from 10-20, so you have 10 different sized towers.

Put them into a bag. Each person closes their eyes and chooses a tower.

Can your child put the right symbol between the two towers to show if one tower is more/less than the other? For example – In this scenario, the first person has pulled out 6, the second person pulled out 4, therefore 6 is greater than ($>$) 4.



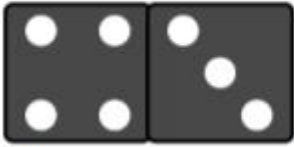
Can you write the sentence that would go with your results? For example, for the game above, the sentence would be – **6 is greater than 4.**

You could also try this game -

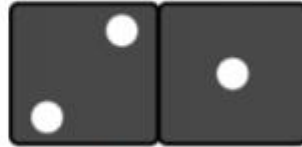
Pick two dominoes to represent two two-digit numbers.

$43 > 21$ $21 < 43$

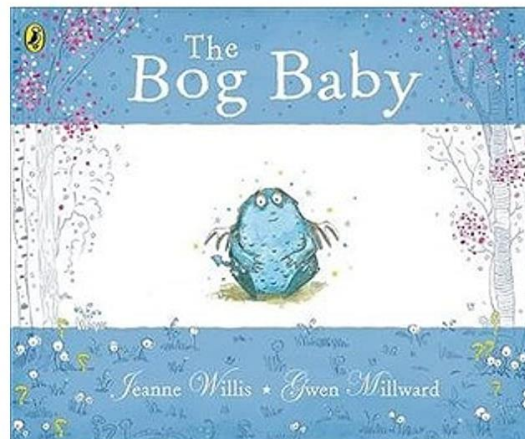
Explain how you know.
