## **Foundations Subject - Science**

Identifying plants we see outside and in our gardens.

Not all plants are exactly the same. Can you think of some different kinds of plants and flowers that you might already know?

When you go out for your daily exercise, see if you can spot any of the common plants on the Plants and flowers seeds sheet provided in the supporting documents (you can either print the sheet or view it on your phone).

If you find any flowers that are not on our sheet, you could take it home (or take a photograph on a grown-ups phone, as there are some flowers we should not pick) and do your own research to find out which plant it is.

If you collect flowers on your daily exercise you could make your own collage and label the different kinds of flowers and plants you found
