Maths

English

They might be interesting, for example, because of how they look (there are some strange plants in the world), how big or small they are, how they get their food, where they live, or maybe because of the food or medicines they can be used to make. You can choose to research one plant in more detail, or find a few facts about four or five different plants. These facts should be presented as a poster which explains why you have found these plants interesting and can include pictures. Your poster can be handwritten or made on a computer or tablet. I have uploaded a target box to show you what you should be including in your writing.

Topic work - Growing

I have found some garden challenges that look fun. I would like you to complete the challenge that asks you to make a map of your garden, making sure you include and label all the features like lawn, shed, apple tree, for example. If you don't have a garden, (or there isn't much to put on a map) you could design a map of an imaginary garden. What plants and features would you like to have?

When you are finished, you could complete some of the other garden challenges if you like (and if the weather allows)!
