This week we are going to think about money. Before answering this question draw pictures of all the UK coins to remind yourself of them.

Dexter has 202 pence.

He has **one** pound coin.

Show five possible combinations of other coins he may have.

Challenge – see if you can find some coins at home, count them and add them together, how much is there in total?

Answers

There are lots of possible combinations, one of mine was



The £1 Dexter already had and



$$100p + 100p + 2p = 202p$$

202p is the same as £2.02
