## Maths

Dora thinks there is more than $£ 5$ but less than $£ 6$ Is Dora correct?


Convince me

Rosie has $£ 5$
Has she got enough money to buy a car and two apples?


What combinations of items could Rosie buy with $£ 5$ ?

## Answers

Q1
Dora is incorrect.
The note is $£ 5$ or 500 p.
The coins are 50P + 20p + 20p + 20P + 10p + 10p = 130p
In total Dora has $\mathbf{5 0 0 p}+\mathbf{1 3 0 p}=\mathbf{6 3 0}$ p. 630p is the same as $£ 6.30$
Dora has more than $£ 6$

Q2
A car and two apples would cost $335 p+85 p+85 p=505 p$.
Rosie does not have enough money for a car and two apples.

There could be a few possible answers for items Rosie could buy with her money. Ask a grown up to check these for you.
