Edible Peanut Butter Slime



You will need:

500g white marshmallows

a jar of smooth peanut butter

chocolate chips (or coloured, sugar-coated chocolates)



Instructions:

- 1. Put the marshmallows in a microwaveable bow
- Place the marshmallows in the microwave and warm slightly. You will need to watch them carefully – you want them to be at the point where they are beginning to melt so that you can stir them.
- 3. Stir the warm marshmallows.
- Add three heaped tablespoons of peanut butter and mix. Continue to add the peanut butter until you get the right consistency you wish to have for your slime.
- 5. Now for the fun part. Play with your slime stretch it, squash it, squeeze it and eat it!

Tip: you can mix in edible treats to your peanut butter slime such as crushed biscuits, chocolate chips, sprinkles... Whatever edible treat you like!
