Maths

Today is all about your times tables!

I want you to practise your times tables today. Once you have practised them, you can then do the times tables test I have put on a video.

Here are some fun ways you can practise your times tables at home – you can do as many as you like!

1. TTRS
2. Hit the button
3. Speed tables – time yourself how long it takes to write down each times table. Can you improve and beat your scores?
4. Song – Play a song. How many times tables can you write down before the song ends?
5. Dice – Roll 2 dice (or 1 die twice) and multiply the two numbers. Play against an adult or sibling – who can say the answer the quickest?
6. Dominoes – Turn a domino over and multiply the two numbers. Play against someone and whoever says it the quickest wins the domino. You could play by turning two dominoes over and multiplying the number on each domino.
7. Playing cards – Turn two cards over and multiply the two numbers together (Jack = 11, Queen = 12, King = 13, Joker = 0). Play on your own or against someone to see who can win the most cards.
8. Keep fit challenge – Recite your times tables whilst doing an exercise (eg running on the spot, jumping jacks, skipping, jumping on the trampoline). Your grown ups or older siblings could shout out questions for you to answer whilst you exercise (eg 7x5).
9. Bingo! – Create a multiplication bingo game. Write 6 numbers on a piece of paper which are in specific times tables (you could choose 2 or 3 different times tables). Write the multiplications for these times tables on small bits of paper (eg. 5x6). Once you have all multiplications, mix them up and turn one at a time. If you have the answer to that multiplication, then you cross it out. Play against an adult or sibling.

English

We're going to keep going with our work on the 'ation' suffix again today. The information I shared with you about the spelling rules for adding this suffix is still on the school website and still in Wednesday's section. Use that to help you to do this activity.

When you have done it and if you feel like doing something trickier, I challenge you to find an 'ation' word for every letter of the alphabet. See if you can find all 26!

Make nouns from these verbs, using the suffix -ation. Remember you may have to follow some spelling rules.

Rule 1: When a word ends in a 'y', change to 'i' before the suffix -ation is added.

Rule 2: The silent 'e' at the end of a root word is dropped before adding -ation.

Rule 3: If the root word ends in 'ate', drop the 'ate' when -ation is added.

Foundation Subject – French
