Maths

This week we will be exploring 'doubling' which means twice as many. Let's begin following the link below to watch Numberblocks to find out more about doubling.

Here are some doubling games to play-

Make the Double

Use any small items you have at home such as coins, cars, pencils, shells, buttons or pasta. Grown ups are to lay out a number of items in a line. Children are to double the amount by laying out exactly the same amount. How many are there altogether? Each time say, for example, 'double 4 is 8'. You can make this game as tricky as you like! You could also use your fingers with adults holding up some fingers and children holding up exactly the same number to double the amount as quickly as you can!

Friend in the Mirror

For this game you need a mirror and numbers to 10 or 20 written on pieces of paper. Adults are to hold up a number. Children are to hold up some fingers to a mirror to make the number the adult is holding. So, if number 6 was held up, three fingers would need holding next to the mirror to make 6, as your friend in the mirror would also have three. As you play this will give you the opportunity to talk about odd numbers and how we do not make odd numbers when doubling. So, if you held up number 5 it cannot be made by doubling whole fingers.

Answers

There are no answers to these activities but we hope you enjoyed playing the games and are developing your doubling skills!

Literacy
