This week we are going to be focusing on measurement. In Year 1 we need to be able to use words to compare height and length, such as: Long, longer, short, shorter, tall, taller.

We need to know that height is a type of length. Height is measuring how tall something is (up and down).

I would like you to find objects in your home that you can compare the heights of – this can be people or objects such as teddies, a door etc.


Can you say who/what is taller/shorter? How do you know?

For example, you could compare two people in your home -

Dad is taller than me. I am shorter than Dad.

Remember when we are comparing height it is very important that the objects start on the same point to make it fair (it would not be fair if someone was standing on a step while the other person was not).


You may like to print out the sheet provided in the Resources section or use it to show you how to record your ideas. We can't wait to see your designs!
