- A fronted adverbial is a sentence opener that says how, when or where something is happening. It is separated from the rest of the sentence with a comma

- An apostrophe for possession is used when something belongs to someone, the turtle's shell, for example

- Expanded noun phrases use a determiner, two adjectives and then a noun.
