Messy/Sensory Play:

Sensory play supports language development, cognitive growth, fine and gross motor skills, problem solving skills, and social interaction. It is also great fun!

Get creative and create a pig sty!

- You can use real mud/soil/compost and water or brown paint and water. Throw in some shredded wheat (or anything dry and crunchy). This will give lots of opportunities to explore different textures.
- Use small world farm animals *or* any small plastic toys e.g. Lego figures, dinosaurs or dolls etc. Pretend they went on a trip to the farm and got stuck in the mud!
- Next, have a bucket of soapy water to clean the toys or animals with. Use an old toothbrush or sponge for scrubbing!

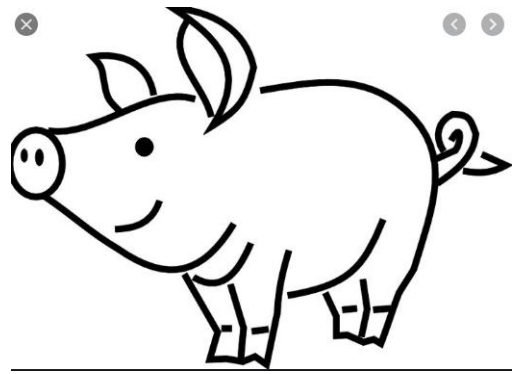
Mud Theme Writing Centre:

Maths

Splat The Pig Game:



You will need:

- A simple picture of a pig
- Dice
- 'Mud' ...use counters or buttons or chocolate buttons/choc chips, pennies, raisin etc

Roll the dice, using 'careful counting' count the dots slowly by touching each dot whilst counting. Splat the same correct amount of mud onto the pig.

Challenge!

Add a second dice or roll it twice to count a greater number of mud splats.
