### Measuring

Using small world farm animals, cuddly teddies or favourite toys for this activity; gather 4 or 5 together and ask your child to put them in order of size. Smallest to largest.

- Which animal/toy is medium?
- Choose one of the toys/animals e.g. the smallest. Can your child find something around the house that is smaller
- Try this with the largest item they ordered too!
- Don't stop there measure, order and compare lots of items from around your house e.g. shoes, spoons, pillows, pans!
- Build a Lego tower the same size as an object and count how many Lego bricks tall it is!



This week we are going to be learning about what food we can get from a farm!

Read and share the "Where does food come from" (saved as supporting information) to introduce the subject of where food comes from. Explain that all food comes from a plant or an animal.

Next:

- Set out two plates and explain that one is for food that comes from plants
- one is for food that comes from animals, label the plates if you can
- Gather a few items from your cupboards/ fridge/ freezer. Stick with simple items for now such as apples, strawberries, potatoes, sausages, chicken nuggets etc.
- Discuss each item with your child and ask them to put it on the correct plate.

Explain that all of these items come from farms. Take a look at the short video clip of children doing a similar activity. Did you and your child sort any of the same foods that they did?


