## English

We're going to look at spelling for our English lessons this week.

The first spelling rule we're going to look at is using the letter 'y' to make the sound 'i'. To make this sound using 'y', we have to put 'y' in places other than at the end of the word because we know it makes a different sound at the end of the word.

There are two parts to today's task.

- 1. Write down as many words as you can that use 'y' to make the 'i' sound. One example of this would be 'pyramid'. (If you're not sure how to read that word, ask an adult).
- 2. Watch the video I've put on for you. See if you can rearrange the letters of the anagrams I give you to find some words that use this spelling rule.

## **Observing and Drawing Plants**

Look at the PowerPoint about observing plants. Find a plant (in your garden or on a walk). Can you create your own detailed, labelled picture showing your plant in as much detail as possible?
