Today we are going to play a pairs game. Using pieces of paper you need to write matching doubles on two pieces. See examples below. These have also been added to the Resources section if you prefer to print them.

You can make this game as tricky as you like depending on your child's understanding, using higher numbers if you wish! Lay the numbers out face down and take turns to turn two over. If they are a matching double keep them. Who has the most cards when they have all been used?

As an extra challenge you might like to play Hit the Button Doubles to see how many you can score in one minute. Keep practising to see if you can improve your score!

Answers

You might even like to play some relaxing sounds of the sea whilst you are imagining. Here is a link:

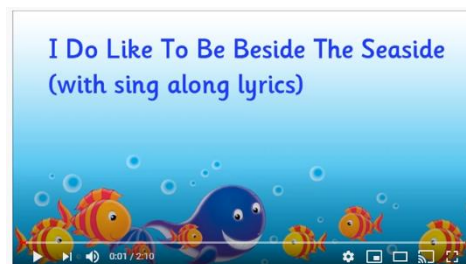
