Answer

$$4+1=5$$

$$5+4=9$$

$$2+5=7$$

$$3+3=6$$

$$1+5=6$$

Answer

The Wolf – bad, mean, selfish, unkind, tricky.

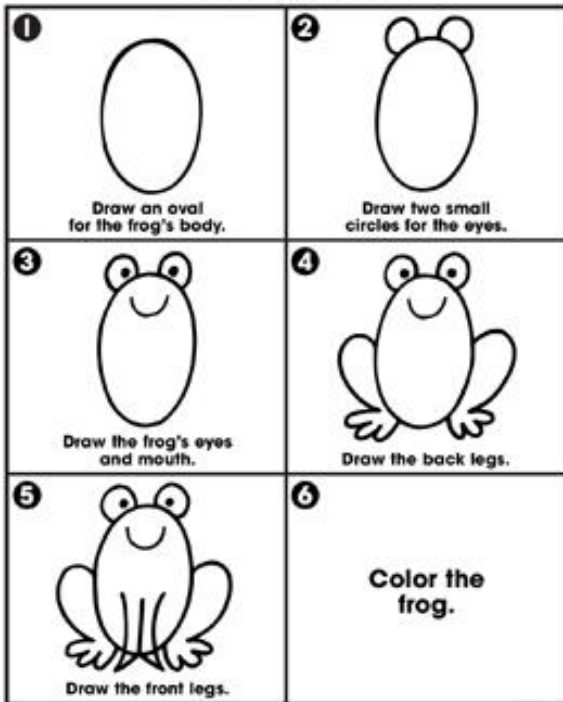
Foundation Subject – The World/Creative
