English – Today we are going to look at silent and unstressed letters. I am sure you have already come across a section like this in your study guides. We have certainly looked at the spellings of words like these in class. Silent letters are not heard when we say a word out loud. For example – knight. We don't hear the letter 'k'. Other letters are a little more tricky to hear, sometimes because of our accents, but are still there! There aren't necessarily silent. For example – business. We would say that the 'i' in business is an unstressed letter.


