CREATING ANCIENT GREEK POTTERY!

There are lots of different ways of decorating a terracotta pot to make it look ancient Greek. Here is one example:



Take an ordinary terracotta pot.
Cut out a template for the
shape you would like and stick it
to the pot with a small amount
of blu-tack.



Carefully draw around the template in pencil. Don't rush - the more detail you include the better.





With a thin
paintbrush, paint
around the outside of
the pencil with black
paint.



You can then paint the rest of the pot in black and go over the details from the template in pencil so that the picture has detail.



You can add decorations and patterns too to both the inside and the outside of the pot.



This is just a simple example. You could use lots more templates and build up a whole scene on your pot. You could show a scene from a Greek myth or from life in ancient Greece.

You can also paint the figures in black, leaving the terracotta for the background. This example didn't use a template but drew the figures straight onto the pot.

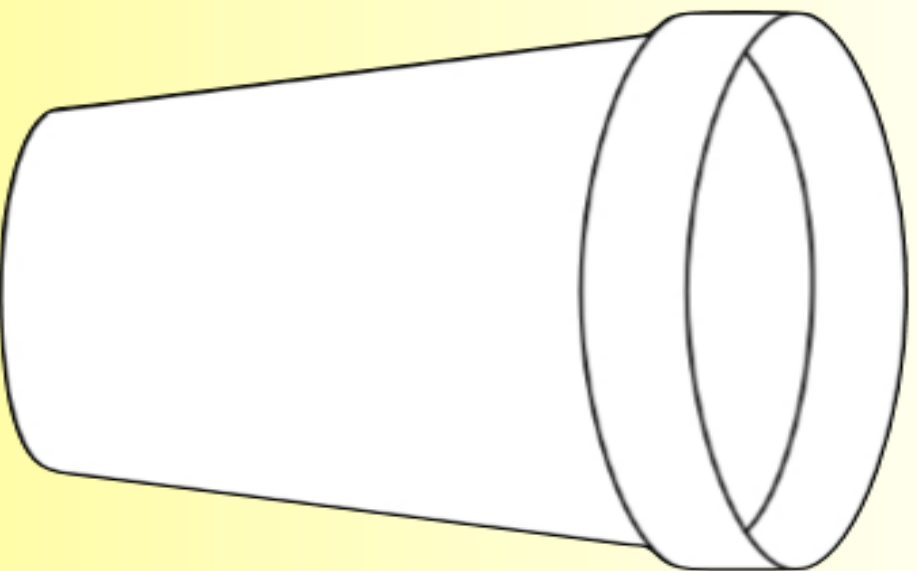




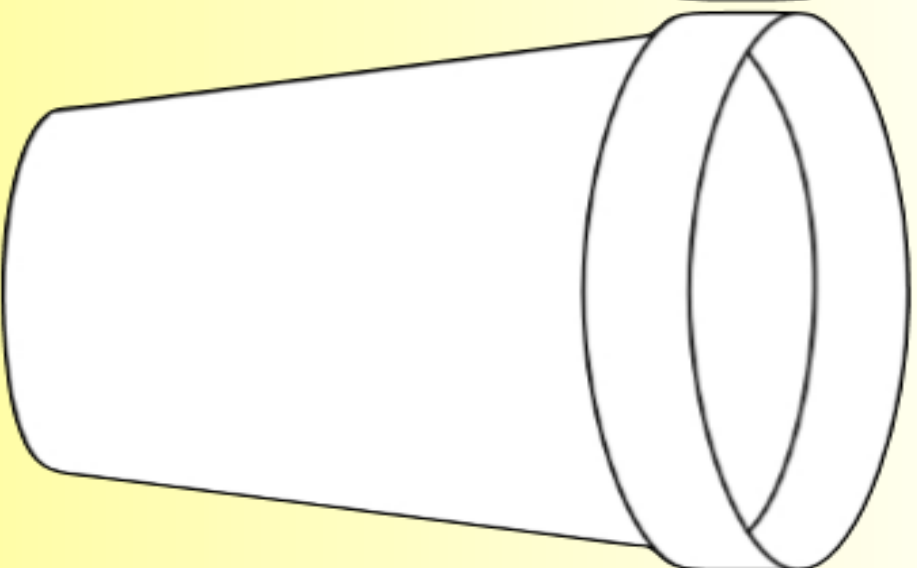

BACK DESIGN:

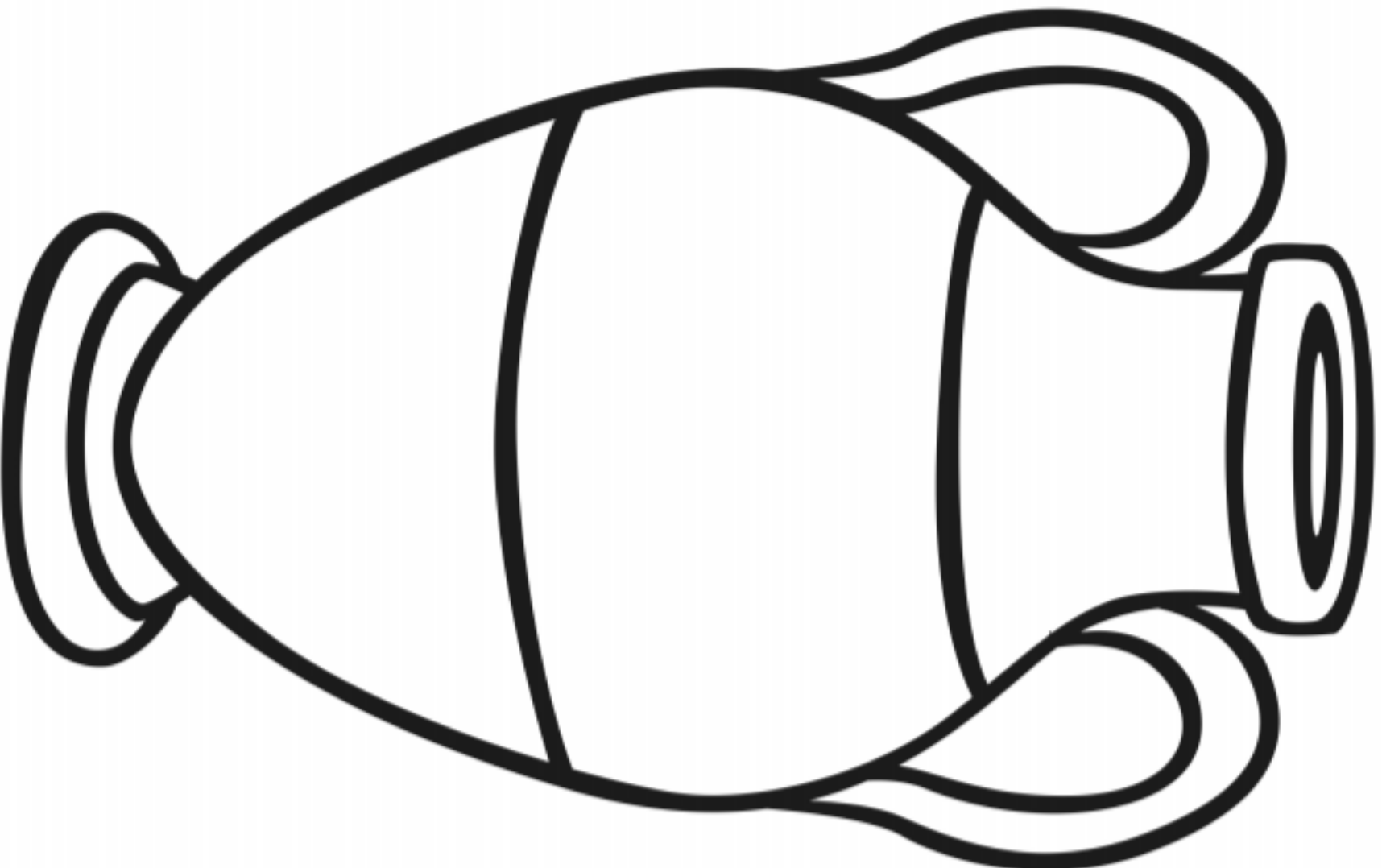

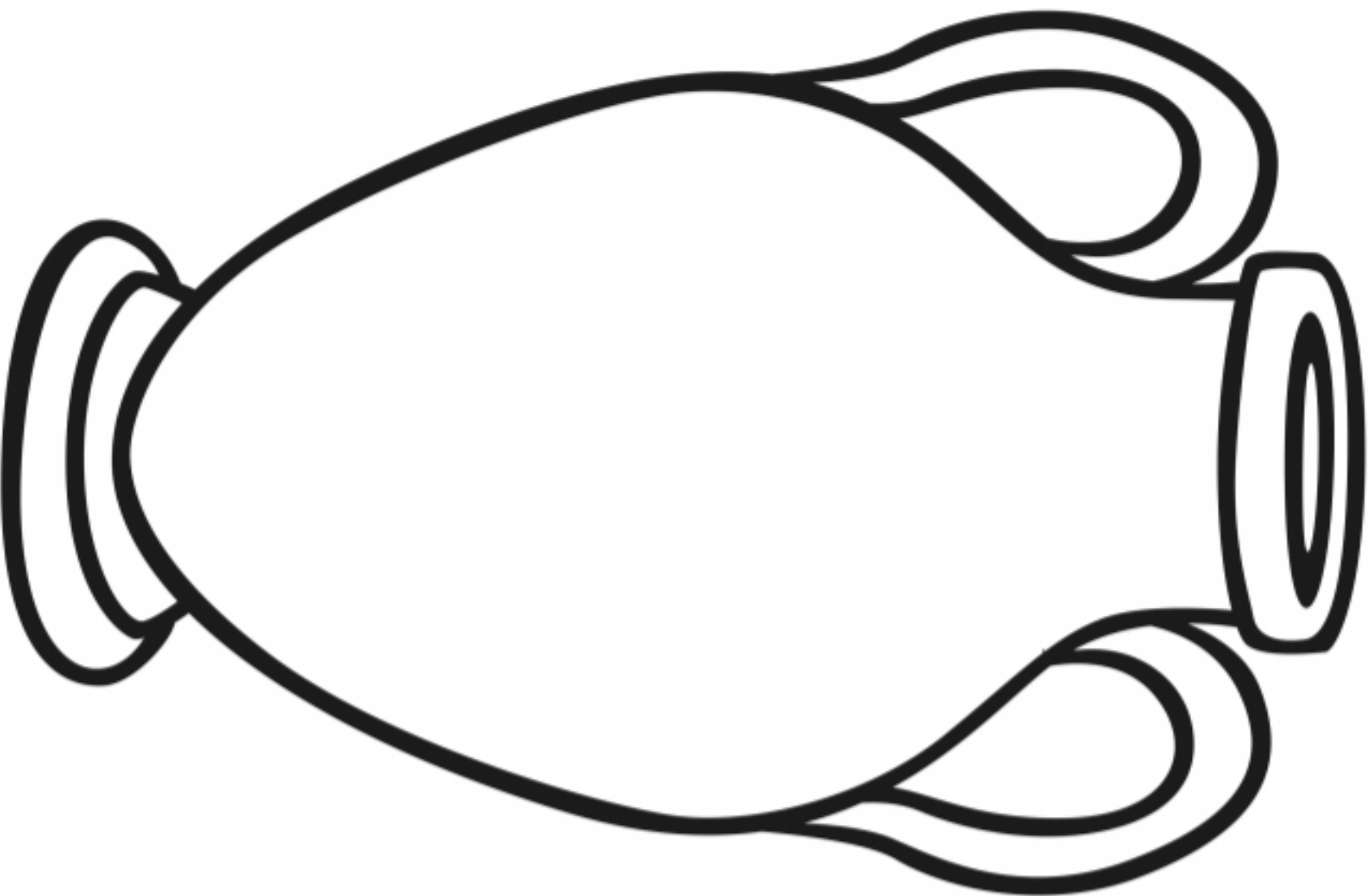
