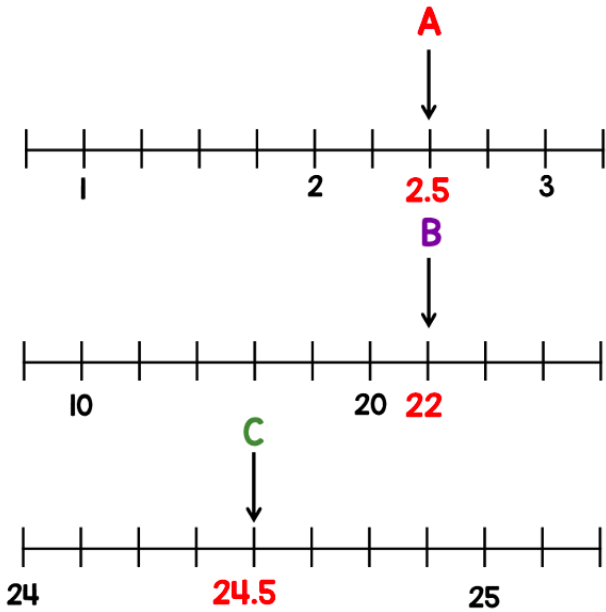


**Maths – Here are some White Rose problems for you to have a go at today. They draw on lots of different strands of Maths so see if you can jog your memories and have a good attempt at answering all of them. Don't forget that you have your study guides to help you too! Don't worry if you get stuck, just try your best 😊**

**1** Given that  $A + B = C$

Draw an arrow pointing to C



**2** George has a box of counters.

- For every 2 red counters there are 5 blue ones.
- George removes 36 blue counters from the box.
- There are now the same amount of red and blue counters.

How many red counters were in the box at the start? **24 red counters.**

**3** Elijah says he divided 32 by a number and got 64

Is this possible?

**Yes, he could divide by 0.5**



**1** Sam has £29

He gets £28 more for his birthday. He buys this cap and jumper with his money.



How much money does he have left?

**Sam has £16.51 left.**

**2** One fifth of a number is 12

What is a half of the number?

$$12 \times 5 = 60$$

$$60 \div 2 = 30$$

**Half of the number is 30**

**3**



Mo gives Alex some stickers.

Alex now has twice as many as Mo.

How many stickers did Mo give Alex?

$$207 + 150 = 357$$

$$357 \div 3 = 119$$

**Mo gives Alex 119 stickers.**

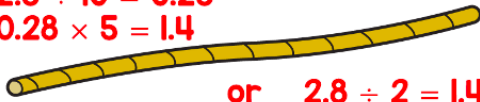


- 1 Circle all the numbers equivalent to 0.25

0.4       $\frac{50}{100}$        $\frac{25}{100}$        $\frac{1}{4}$

- 2 A rope measures 2.8 metres.

$2.8 \div 10 = 0.28$   
 $0.28 \times 5 = 1.4$



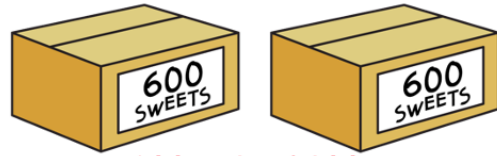
or  $2.8 \div 2 = 1.4$

The rope is cut into 10 equal sized pieces.

What is the total length of 5 of these pieces?

**The total length is 1.4 metres.**

- 3 Sweets come in boxes of 600  
Danny has two boxes of sweets.



$600 \times 2 = 1,200$

He packs the sweets into smaller bags.

There are 21 in each bag.



How many bags can Danny fill using all the sweets?

$1,200 \div 21 = 57 \text{ r } 3$

**Danny can fill 57 bags.**



English – Today we are going to look at the spelling of words containing ‘ie’ and ‘ei’. Remember the rhyme, ‘i before e except after c’? We looked at this pattern not too long ago. However, there were some exceptions to this rule if you remember. Let’s have a look at some of these words today.

### Activity 1

Complete the words in each sentence using either ie or ei.

1. After his lunch, Dylan ate a big **piece** of chocolate cake.
2. Grandma’s heavy shopping bags were **weighing** her down.
3. Joseph loves **Science**, whereas Kyle prefers Art.
4. Samantha goes to an exercise class three times per week at the **leisure** centre.
5. The UFO was full of green **aliens**.

if you can identify the words which are not spelt correctly. Rewrite these words again and include them in a sentence.

Can you think of 6 exceptions to the 'i before e' rule? Write them in a list. Learn the spellings of these words using the 'look, cover, say, write, check' method, or any other technique we use in school.

**How many did you manage to think of? 6? More? Well done!**

Word jumble! See if you can look at the following letters and unscramble them to make a word containing ie or ei.

2. F G I O R E N     **FOREIGN**
3. D E W R I     **WEIRD**
