Maths - recognising notes

5 pounds
10 pounds
20 pounds

One ten pound = 2 five pounds

One twenty pound = 2 ten pounds

Reasoning

Teddy is given one  for Christmas.

Eva is given two 



I got more than you did because my number is bigger.

I got more than you did because I got two notes.



Who is correct?

Explain your reasoning.

Both Teddy and Eva are wrong because they both have £10.

Eva has two £5 notes, which makes £10, and Teddy has a £10 note.

Problem Solving

Always, sometimes, never

Money in notes is worth more than money in coins.

Sometimes - if you have £6 in coins it is worth more than a £5 note. However you could also have less than £5 in coins.
