Maths- Make arrays

There are 2 apples in each row.

There are 3 rows.

2 + 2 + 2 = 6

There are 6 apples altogether.

	3 columns 5 cupcakes in each column	5 rows 3 cupcakes in each row	

Problem solving

Eva begins to make an array with 40 counters.  
She has finished her first row and her first column.  
Complete her array.



Possible answer:  
Array showing 10  
+ 10 + 10 + 10 =  
40

Or  
4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 +  
4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 =  
40

## D&T

Draw and label the different parts of a kite.

### Spars

Give a kite structure, some have special names like "spine" and "spreader".

### Sail

Directs the air to give the kite lift.

### Tail

Adds drag to keep the kite pointed into the wind.

### Line

Prevents the kite from flying away; thicker lines are stronger.
