Maths

Today's work on time is looking at the months of the year and how they are divided up into weeks. It would be helpful to look at a calendar and compare the lengths of different months. I have uploaded some fluency, reasoning and mastery style questions for you to try. This work includes the poem – '30 has September' which is useful to know, so you should learn this poem by heart.

English

Read the kite poems. Find the words that rhyme, and identify the pattern of rhymes (Do lines 1 and 2 rhyme? Do lines 2 and 4 rhyme?)

Then, using these examples for inspiration, I would like you to write your own kite poem. There is a kite poem template that you can use to write your own rhyming lines, giving you a pattern where lines the same colour should rhyme. However you don't have to print this out as you could just write it out yourself, maybe onto some kite shaped paper. If you would like a challenge, you can write your own poem without the template. You can choose! When you have written your poem, I would like you to decorate around it to make it look attractive.

Topic work – DT – Kites

Using what you found out from your shapes and materials investigation last session, you are going to design your own kite. I have included a design sheet, but you could just make your own sheet. Remember to plan all the tools and materials you will use, so you can be ready to make your kite next week.
