Maths

After that, I have included some fluency, reasoning and mastery style questions on our website for you to try.

English

This sheet has different activities for practising correct use of spelling, punctuation and grammar. Just write your answers on paper, and then check the answer sheet on Friday.

I have included a list of spellings that you could practise this week. They are all shortened or contracted words. When you practise spelling them, make sure you put the apostrophe in the correct place. There is also a 'Crack the code' activity using these words. Can you break the code?

Topic work – DT – Kites

Today you are going to investigate the different shapes and materials used for kites. You will need different materials such as newspaper, tissue paper, dustbin liners, plastic bags, wrapping paper and wallpaper to draw and cut out the shapes of the different kites. (You don't need to investigate all these materials, just make a selection from what you have at home. You could even investigate different materials if you have others that are suitable.).

Read the information and then use the shapes template sheet to help you cut out different shapes from different materials. Which shape was the hardest/easiest to make? Which material was the hardest/easiest to make? You will use this information to help when you come to design your own kite.
