Jazz	free style and syncopation (not sticking to simple rhythms and beats)	piano, guitar, smooth voices and brass
Rock	• loud! • mainly counted in 4s	drums, electric guitars and strong voices
Classical	big sounds of the orchestra and dramatic pieces can be long compositions	orchestra instruments
