Glossary

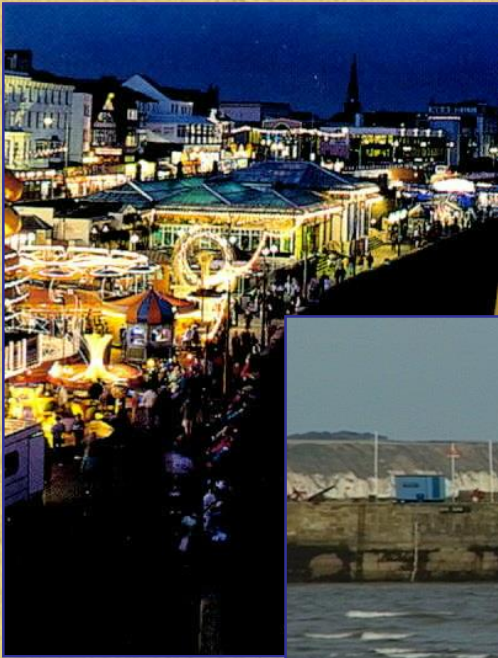
-  **bay** a place where the coast bends inwards and sea fills the space.
-  **beach** land by the edge of the sea, usually covered with sand or small stones.
-  **caravan site** an area filled with caravans where people can stay while on holiday.
-  **cliff** a steep rock close to the sea.
-  **fairground** a place where there are roundabouts and other rides, stalls and shows.
-  **harbour** a place where boats can stay safely in the water when not at sea.
-  **lighthouse** a tower with a bright light that warns ships about rocks or other dangers.
-  **pier** a structure for people to walk along that is built out into the sea.
-  **sand dunes** hills or mounds of sand held together by plants, often near the sea.
-  **shingle** a lot of small stones by the edge of the sea.
