# English

Today we're going to read a myth that gives us a warning. You might have heard the phrase 'you flew too close to the sun' which means you did really well at something but pushed it too far and failed. This myth is where that phrase comes from. I've included the written story and today I'd like you to turn it into a comic strip. Think about what a comic strip needs- there's not much room for a lot of text so choose your sentences carefully. You need to shrink the story down but keep all of the important parts so the myth is clear. On Monday I'll show you the version of the comic strip I have so you can compare yours and see how clearly you tell the story.

# Foundation subject - History

I can use sources and research to find out about the Ancient Greek Olympics.

The Ancient Greeks created the Olympics but how do we know this? How do we know what games or sports they played in their Olympics? We can do this by looking closely at artefacts people have found dating back to Ancient Greek times.

Use sources/research to compare Olympics today with ancient Greek Olympics. I have included lesson slides to help you. Use a Venn diagram to show your findings – I have included one you can print or just draw your own. Write a short conclusion saying what you have found out.
