Maths

Today we are thinking about capacity. Explore using a range containers of different sizes and shapes. Can you make them half full, nearly empty and nearly full? You could use water, sand, rice, cereal or other small items. Try to use words such as tall, thin, narrow, wide and shallow as you talk about your work.

Pour the contents of one container into another to compare how much they will hold or their 'capacity'. Use a small container to fill three large ones. How many small ones will it take to fill them? Which one will hold the most? You may like to record your work on a chart like this:

My small container is a yogurt pot.

container	my guess	measure
bucket	8 pots	10 pots
bowl	5 pots	5 pots
bottle	9 pots	6 pots

The bucket holds the most.

The bowl holds the least.
