Maths

Today's work asks you to convert amounts from pounds to pence and pence to pounds in order to then compare amounts. When we convert amounts we are either multiplying by 100 (pounds to pence) or dividing by 100 (pence to pounds). Use a place value chart to help you do this as you will need 2 columns after the decimal point.

Write the first number in the chart and then move it left or right depending on whether you are multiplying or dividing – remember you need to move 2 places when \times or \div by 100.

I'd like you to read/listen to the myth and then answer these questions:

1. Eurydice was a nymph. Use a dictionary or look online- what is a nymph in Greek mythology?
2. Why were Pluto and Persephone so amazed that a living person reached their kingdom?
3. Why do you think Pluto agreed to release Eurydice from the Underworld on the condition that Orpheus didn't look back to see her?

Thinking about everything we know about Greek myths, would you say Orpheus was a hero? Why?
