Challenge -

Rosie, Alex and Mo are comparing the height of Mrs Rose and Jack.



Rosie



Mrs Rose is tall than Jack.

Alex



Jack is short than Mrs Rose.

Mo



Mrs Rose is longer than Jack.

Can you improve their sentences to make them more accurate?

Possible answer:

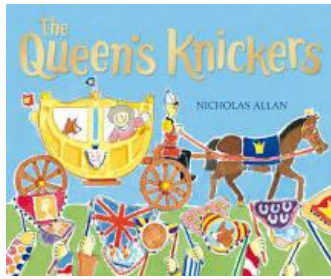
Rosie – Mrs Rose is **taller** than Jack.
Alex – Jack is **shorter** than Mrs Rose.

Mo – Mrs Rose is **taller** than Jack.
Taller is a better word than longer because we are comparing height.
