Maths

We're going to move on to look at times that don't have the big hand pointing exactly to one of the numbers on the clock. We know that each number shows five minutes of time. The big hand on the clock on the left is pointing between the 4 and the 5. We can see the little lines marking each minute. If the clock was pointing to the 4, the time would be twenty past two. But it's pointing to one minute more than that, so the time is twenty one minutes past two. See if you can read the time on these clocks in the same way.

6. How many of the Argonauts do we already know?
7. What happened to Heracles?
8. How do you think Jason and the Argonauts will defeat the Harpies?
