3D Shapes

Last week, we consolidated or reminded ourselves of our learning about 2D shapes.

Today we are going to learn about **3D shapes**.

Preschool class already know the phrase:

"2D shapes are FLAT like a MAT"

now continue this phrase with:

"but a 3D shape has a BASE and takes up SPACE." Now repeat all of this together to practise.

Next, read and talk about the separate information resource from our Home School Learning "everyday 3D shapes" as we introduce the new words **sphere, cube, pyramid, cuboid, cylinder and cone**.

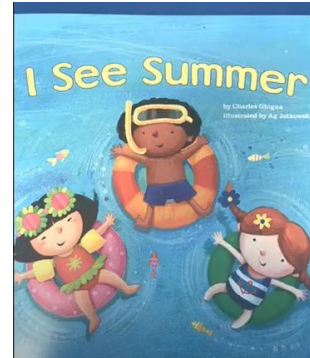
Storytime:

I See Summer

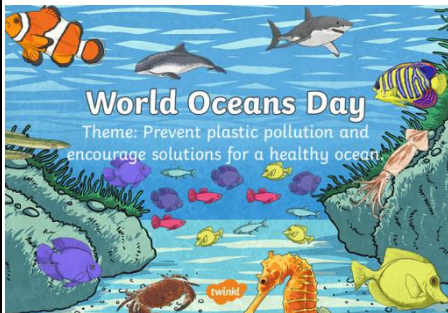
