## Maths – Comparing mass

### Fluency

*ball = watering can*

*bunny > car*

*rubber duck < watering can*

*rubber duck > car*

*The duck is the lightest of all. It is lighter than the car and the watering can (which has the same mass as the ball). The bunny is heavier than the car so must also be heavier than the rubber duck.*



### Reasoning

Order the objects from heaviest to lightest: *apple, sandwich, yoghurt, crisps, biscuit.*

*The second heaviest object is the sandwich.*

*Three biscuits have the same mass as one apple.*
