Foundation Subject – Science

I've found a few examples of living things from some of the habitats. I've only included habitats that aren't in our local area because they're a bit more challenging.

Desert- Bactrian camel, armadillo, jerboa, rattlesnake

Coral reef- coral, moray eel, brittle star, clown fish

Rainforest- howler monkey, quetzal, okapi

Arctic- Arctic hare, Beluga whale, narwhal, polar bear

Swamp- alligator, nutria, snapping turtle

Savannah- baboon, giraffe, fossa, ostrich
