**Maths**

Today you are going to look at pounds and pence in money. If you completed Monday's work, then that should have helped you for today. You are going to be using part-whole models to sort money into pounds and pence to make it easier for us to count it. You are going to think about how much money there is in both pounds and pence. You need to think about how you write money when using both pounds and pence. Remember we need to use a decimal point and that there must be 2 digits after the decimal point to show the pence. Also remember that 100p = £1.

I have put your questions onto a separate sheet today as there are pictures of money on there, which I wanted to make big enough so you could see it clearly. You may print this sheet off if you want to or you can just work on paper. There is a fluency, reasoning and mastery to have a go at.

**English**

We've already met a few of the gods that the Greeks included in their myths. We have Zeus, king of the gods, who lives at the top of Mount Olympus and has lightning as his weapon; we have Hera, Zeus' clever wife; and we know Athena, goddess of wisdom who can be very jealous. In 'The Labours of Heracles', we met Apollo, god of the sun who rides a chariot; and Artemis, goddess of the hunt. She is also goddess of the moon. All of these gods and goddesses lived on Mount Olympus. But there were some who weren't allowed to live on Mount Olympus. Hades, Zeus' brother, was god of the Underworld. Greeks believed that this was where you went when you died. Hades' wife, Persephone (who he tricked into being his wife), lived down there with him for three quarters of the year and was allowed to come to the surface for three months. The Greeks believed that this was what caused summertime, when the Earth rejoiced to have her back. There was also someone else who lived in the Underworld, and a fearsome beast who guarded it. I've included this extra information in the 'Underworld Information' sheet for you. Your task today, before we read a myth set in the Underworld on Friday, is to see if you can imagine what these characters looked like and draw them. I'll show you some pictures people have drawn of them and you can see how yours compares.

**Foundation Subject – Science**

This week you are going to learn about how the environments in which animals live can change. Some of these changes are caused by humans and some occur naturally. These changes can threaten the environment and living things who live there. Look at the lesson slides I have included to find out a little bit about these changes.
