Today we will be focusing on comparing the length of an object.

Length is how long something is (from one end to the other).

I would like you to find objects in your home that you can compare the lengths of – this can be objects such as the sofa, a bed, utensils etc.


Can you say what is longer/shorter? How do you know?

For example, you could compare two kitchen utensils -

The fork is longer than the teaspoon. The teaspoon is shorter than the fork.

Remember when we are comparing length it is very important that the objects start on the same point to make it fair.

Did you hear or see any other words ending in 'y' in the story?


Have you noticed that the 'ee' sound at the end of the word is made with a 'y'?
