Reasoning

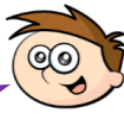
4 children describe their birthdays.

Can you work out their birthdays and order them from earliest to latest in the year?

Mastery

Whitney asks Rosie and Jack a question.

Some months have 31 days, some months have 30 days. How many months have 28 days?



Only February has 28 days.

Rosie

Every month has 28 days.



Jack

Who do you agree with? Explain your thinking.

**English**

Now that you know the features of a Greek myth, I'd like you to read another one and see if you can find all of the features. We need to read quite a few Greek myths so that we become familiar with them because they are a completely different genre of story. This time I'd like you to read the myth 'Bellerophon and Pegasus'. I've also uploaded a video of me reading it so that you can hear what the names sound like. What you need to do is find where each of the features of Greek myths is included in the story.

- Who is the hero?
- What is the monster?
- What is the test?
- Who helps the hero?
- Is there a king or queen?
- Where does the hero journey to on his quest?

**Foundation Subject – French**

We're still going to be working on learning the names and flags of different countries. Today we're going to learn how to tell people where we live. Use the resource I've uploaded to learn how to tell people where you live and how to include each of the countries correctly in a sentence. If you don't have anyone in your house who remembers learning French, put the French words into Google translate so that you can hear them and repeat them back, the way you would do with me in the classroom.

The work I'd like you to do is the last slide in the resource. You need to match the sentences to the correct flag of the country in the sentence. You already know a lot of them. When we come back to school I'm going to ask you to say 'I live in England' so make sure you know how to pronounce the sentence correctly!
